

## MEDICAID-COMPLIANT SESSION NOTES

### Questions & Answers

<b>Q</b>	We have been told by the county to use NOCPT under the CPT for a group of one. Is this what should be entered for a group of one?
<b>A</b>	You can choose NOCPT or use a CPT code that does not have narrative indicating “group of two or more.” If the child was serviced individually, you might use an individual code for the group enrollment. Either option is correct.
<b>Q</b>	If nursing is done (hooking up a child’s feeding tube) at the same time as another service, does one have to be marked as, “Does not meet Medicaid requirements?”
<b>A</b>	As per Medicaid Q&A #75 – <b><i>Can more than one therapist providing co-treatments bill for the same session? No.</i></b> If one of the therapies is OT/PT or Speech (which are Medicaid reimbursable services), I would not check the Does not meet Medicaid requirements box for these services. I would mark the nursing service as Medicaid ineligible.
<b>Q</b>	Regarding Defaults – If a therapist selects a child and then realizes it is the wrong child, the defaults do not change to the new child’s default information after a correction to the child has been made. Why?
<b>A</b>	Thank you for bringing this to our attention. This is not working correctly. Our technical team will need to troubleshoot this issue. In the meantime, if you click out of the incorrect child and select the correct child the proper defaults will load.
